Annual reports are designed to give us a "snapshot" of where we've been over the past 12 months. This year we'd like to give you a broader view of where RCN has been and where we're going.



The Jim Robinson Award is presented to individuals for their outstanding volunteer service to RCN. This year, the Board of Directors honors:

Robert W. "Bob" van Niel

Bob graduated from The University of Rochester (A.B. in Economics), The Wharton School at The University of Pennsylvania (M.B.A.) and The Sloan School at MIT (M.S. in Management). He worked for many years at Eastman Kodak, retiring as Kodak's Assistant Comptroller. He has served on numerous boards of directors in the community, including Rochester General Hospital, Via Health and Bexley Hall Seminary. He has served for many years as the Treasurer of the Episcopal Diocese of Rochester. Bob and his wife Elizabeth ("Ann") live in Pittsford and have two grown children

Bob joined the board of what was then Rochester Children's Nursery in 1999. During his tenure on the board he has given generously of his time on the Finance, Audit, Facilities and Capital Initiative Committees. He helped see RCN through a major expansion in 2000-02, and is helping guide RCN's current campaign, Celebrating Kids, Changing Lives. This effort will raise \$1.2 million for renovations of all of RCN's outdoor play areas, as well as much-needed interior renovations.

"Bob Van Niel and his wife Ann have been dedicated to RCN for many, many years," said Executive Director Dr. Lynn Lubecki. "Bob's service on the board has been a great gift to this organization. His support and hours of volunteer time have helped to assure that all children grow to their fullest potential, and for this, we thank Bob and Ann."

Program Spotlight

Special Education

Note: This is an excerpt from a presentation given by Patricia Graff, M.S., Ed., Director of Special Education (SMILE) at RCN's 2017 Staff Appreciation Event.

Sometimes you have to wait until the dust settles. Sometimes you have to wait until the crying stops, the chaos clears. It's then that you'll see the magic that happens here at RCN every day.

...the magic of a boy with autism who came to RCN kicking and screaming on his first day. Just two years later, he's successfully included in kindergarten, playing on soccer and softball teams, participating in karate and enjoying a full life.

...the magic of a 3 year old with Down syndrome who begins in September as non-verbal, not walking, and mouthing and throwing toys like an infant. By May, he's walking, participating in class, singing, dancing, and modeling the language and behaviors of his friends.

...the magic of the family who now understands their daughter's struggles, learns how to secure appropriate services, and contributes to her growth and success.

We may never know the full impact of our work, or how it will impact children's lives in two years, ten years of fifty years; but, we do know that the magic begins at RCN.





Teaching Pyramid

For the past three years, RCN has been implementing a new, data-driven teaching model known as the Teaching Pyramid. The Pyramid model promotes social and emotional skill development in children and focuses on changing teachers' practices through self and team reflection. In every RCN classroom, teachers are creating nurturing, positive relationships and teaching children strategies on how to deal with their peers and their emotions.

"It's an inclusive model," says Anna Nicpon, teacher in the Crickets classroom, "all children can learn effective strategies for solving their problems. You just meet the child where they are at the moment and take them to the next step." RCN's classrooms are filled with solution kits, solution cards, visual cues, and posters to remind children of the skills they can use.

But the Teaching Pyramid doesn't end in the classroom. This spring, ten families attended Positive Solutions for Families, a series of six classes that shares Teaching Pyramid principles with parents and caregivers to utilize in the home. Anna sees the skills as universal. "The Teaching Pyramid has changed how I approach everyone in life."

At RCN, it's all about the relationships we build. For Anna, that foundation is a boon to teachers. "I feel more supported in my role and more valued here because of the support and respect that the Teaching Pyramid instills."

"It's hard to learn, play active games or take a nap when it's too warm or too cold," noted Jo-Ann Halloran, RCN's Director of Children's Programs. "Our children will be much more comfortable with modern heating and air conditioning systems. And, we'll save money on utility bills, to re-invest in RCN's high-quality programs."
