What program at RCN...

- Supports over 180 small businesses in Greater Rochester, almost all of which are owned and operated by Women of Color?
 - Serves 2,000 children in our region?
 - Distributes over \$900,000 annually to in-home childcare providers?

The Family Child Care Satellites of Greater Rochester (FCCSGR) supports in-home, family childcare providers in Greater Rochester. FCCSGR was founded in 1981 by the United Way, Rochester's Child and the Rochester Area Community Foundation, and is coordinated by longtime childcare advocate Nancy Kaplan. In-home providers serve families with flexible schedules, neighborhood locations, language and cultural preferences, and quality care at affordable costs.

The Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) is a federally funded outreach that provides reimbursements for nutritious meals and snacks to childcare centers (like RCN) and day care homes.

"Working together, FCCSGR and CACFP enable thousands of children to receive high-quality care and education," said Ivelisse Marrero, Director of these programs.





Elizabeth "Liz" Steinberg: A Family's Legacy at RCN

The Steinberg Family has been a pillar of Rochester Childfirst Network for nearly 40 years. On June 15, 2023, RCN said goodbye to Board Member Elizabeth "Liz" Steinberg. Liz died at her home after a long illness.

Liz was born in Syracuse, where her father, Charles Eliot Steinberg, was finishing his law degree following his service in WWII. Liz's mother Muriel was an undergrad, and they came to know each other at S.U. Her father went on to a successful law practice and teaching career--the Charles E. Steinberg Fellowship in Psychiatry and the Law was established in his honor at the U of R. Muriel was Vice President at Lincoln Rochester Bank on South Avenue, where she became RCN's banker. Muriel fell in love with RCN's mission and dedicated over three decades of her life to RCN.

Liz began a career as a paralegal, which led her into politics. She soon worked in the Washington office of Rep. Frank Horton, and later in Albany working for Assembly Leader Perry Duryea. She then returned to Rochester, getting involved with WXXI, the RPO, the Memorial Art Gallery and other nonprofits. Following her mother's passing in 2020, Liz took up the Steinberg mantle on RCN's Board.

"We truly appreciated Liz's insights, her hard work and her generosity," said Board Chair Dr. Joseph Sergio. "If you asked Liz to do something, you knew it would be done well." Liz is survived by her daughter Lindsay (Warren) Steinberg McGrail and granddaughter, Isabel Jane (Seen in this photo with Liz). Gifts in Liz's memory will be directed to the Muriel D. Scholarship Fund at RCN.

Miss Phoofa attended RCN as a child. We were blessed to have her return as an employee in 2021. During her too-short time at RCN she served as a greeter, a Teaching Assistant and a 1:1 aide in the Preschool Special Education Program. She filled in whenever and wherever needed, always with a smile on her face. Thanks to her many roles at RCN, she knew or interacted with just about every child in our care.

"Phoofa was a happy and joyful person who radiated positive energy," said Executive Director Ann Marie Stephan. "She was a 'natural' in her work with children, always playful and engaging. She had excellent intuition and devoted herself to helping children grow and learn."
